### Major in Middle Childhood Education (B.S.E.)

#### Department of Middle-Secondary Education and Instructional Technology

The B.S.E. major in Middle Childhood Education prepares outstanding middle childhood educators who can meet the needs of young adolescents in today's diverse, highly technological, and changing society. Graduates have a well developed content knowledge in two fields (language arts, mathematics, reading, science, or social studies), and they are able to construct and implement interdisciplinary instruction creatively. Upon graduation, successful candidates will be recommended for certification in grades 4-8 in two areas of concentration.

#### When Can People Apply ??

Applications for acceptance into Teacher Education for MCE majors will begin spring 2009. To be accepted, students must have a 2.50 composite grade point average on all undergraduate coursework previously completed; students must have passed the GACE Basic Skills Assessment (see <http://www.gace.nesinc.com> for more information) or presented official scores to demonstrate exemption; students must have successfully completed Areas A through F of the program of study; and students must participate in an interview with program faculty.
